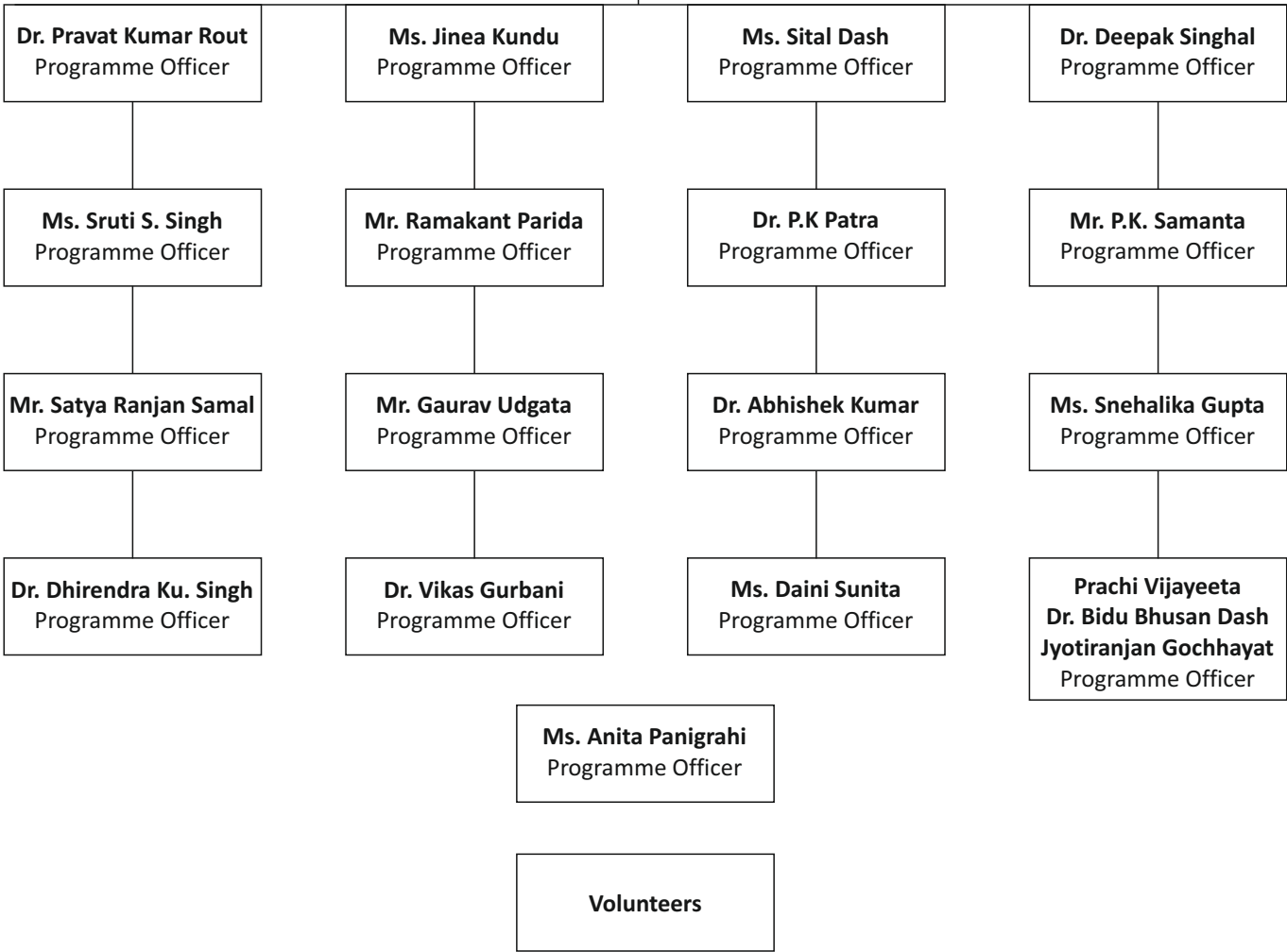

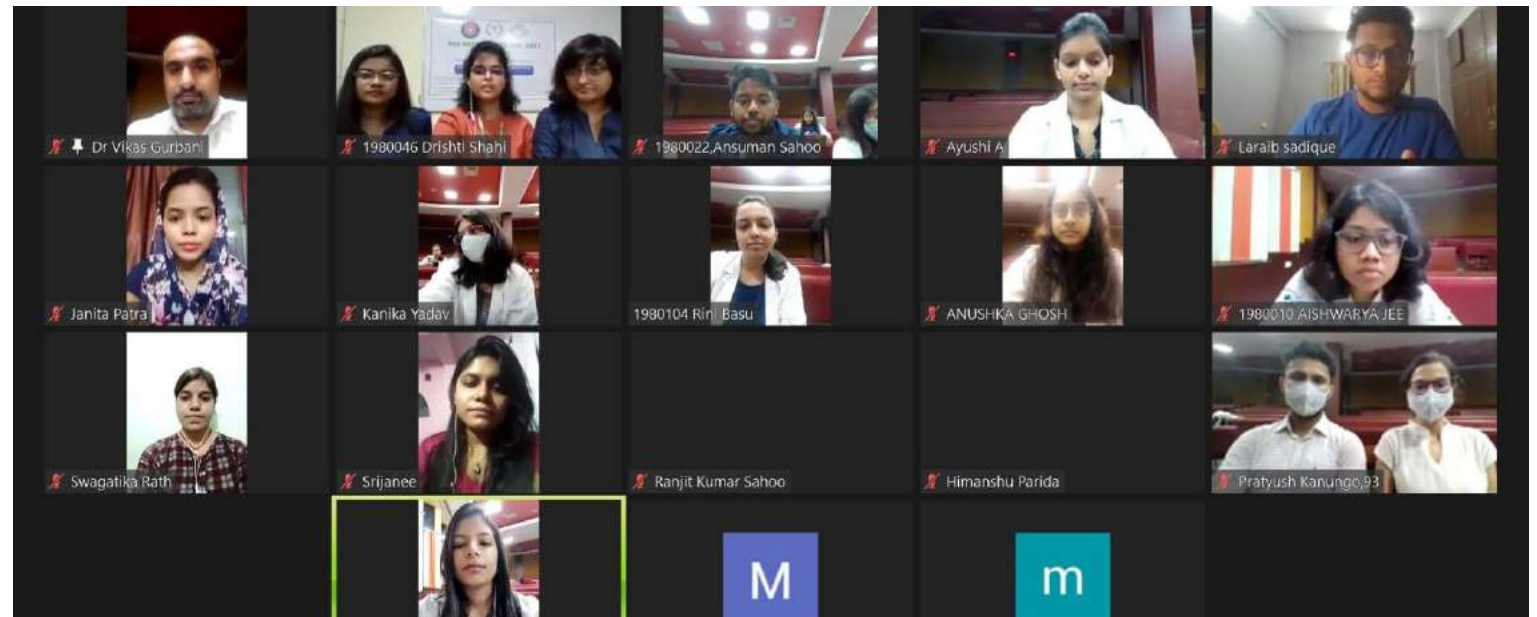
I hope through this, several readers will find their conscience and call rattled or at least it will duly serve as an affirmation to their noble duties performed for and in the world.

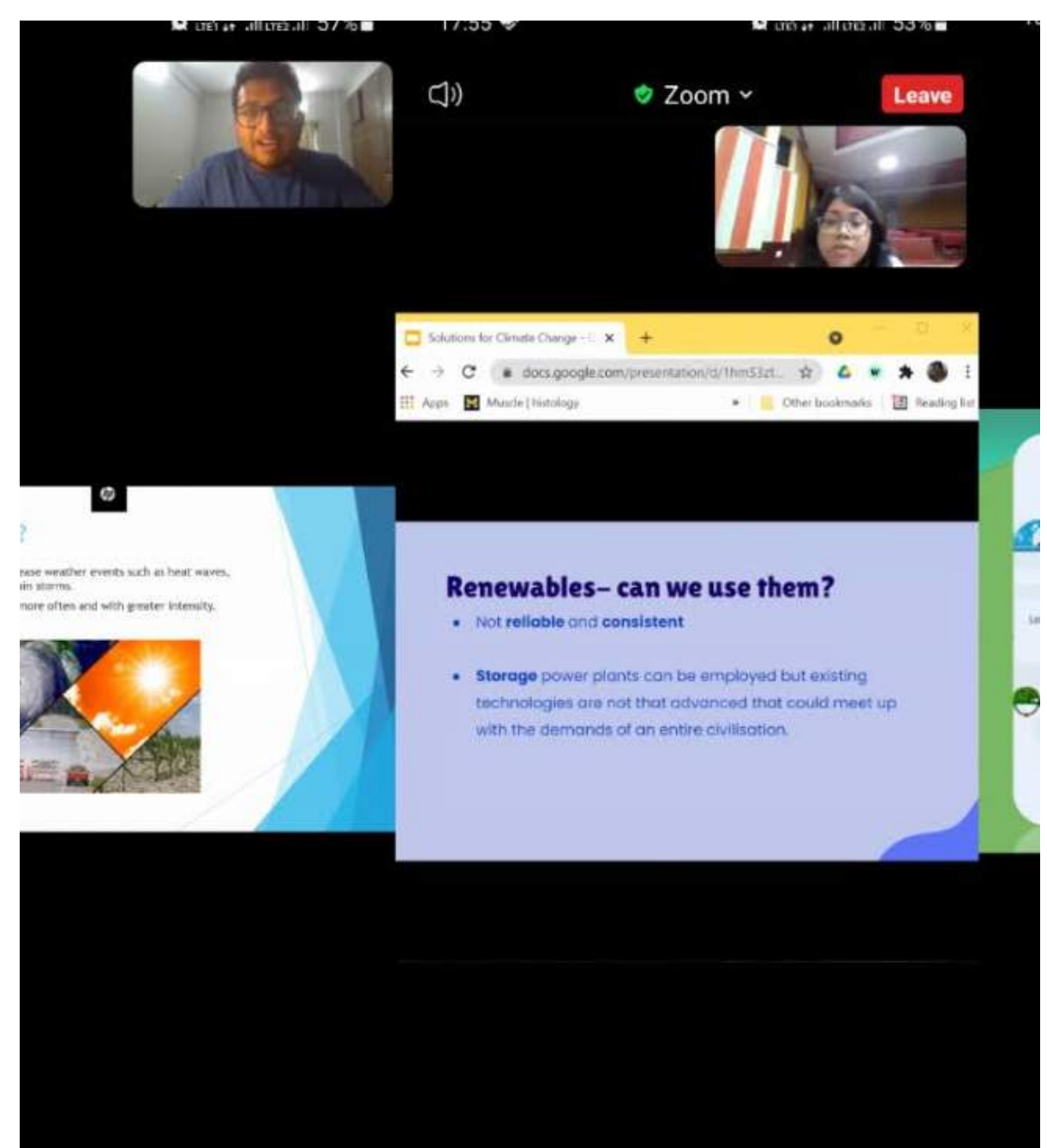

NSS KIIT School of Computer Engineering celebrates Children's Day

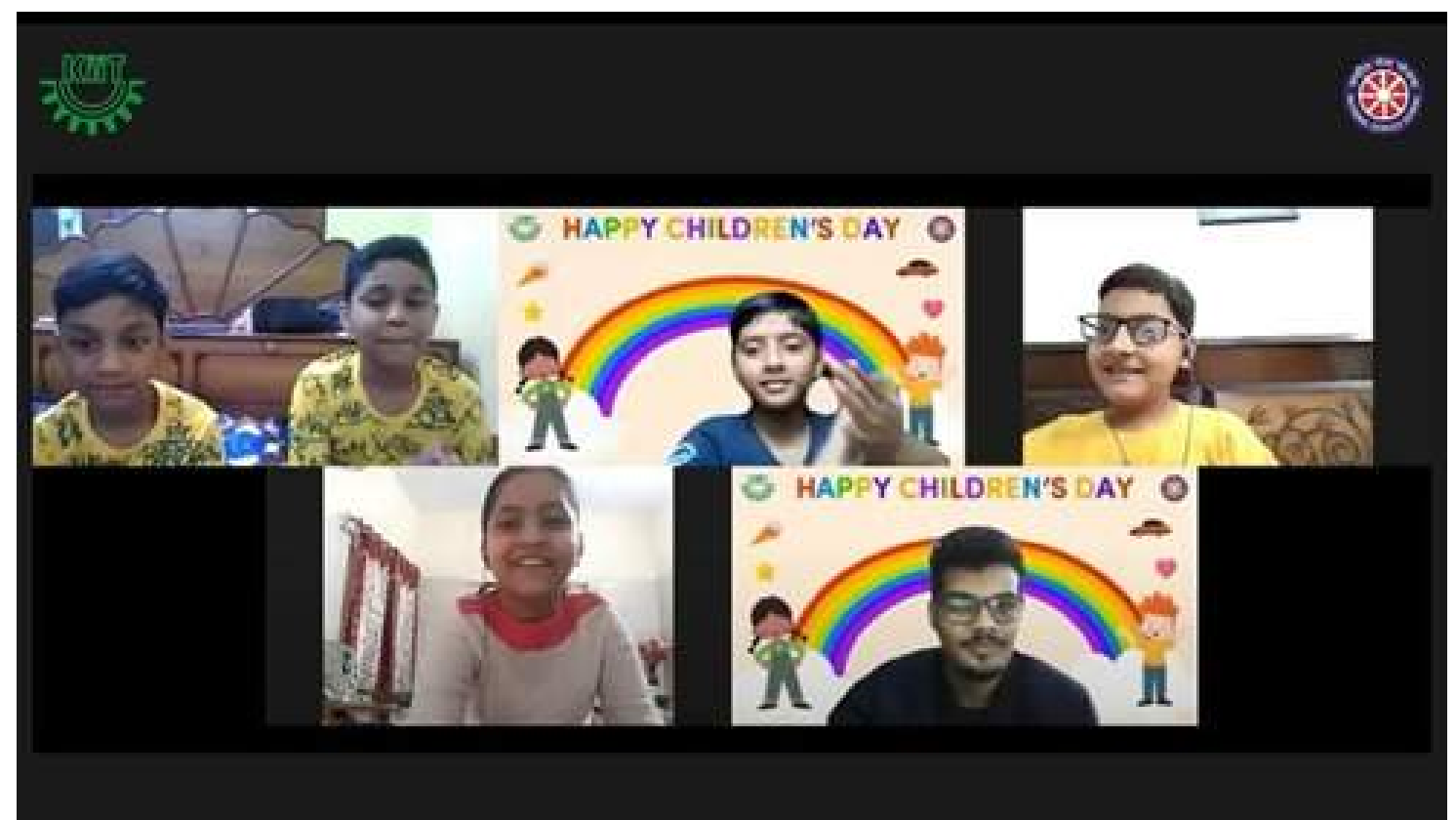

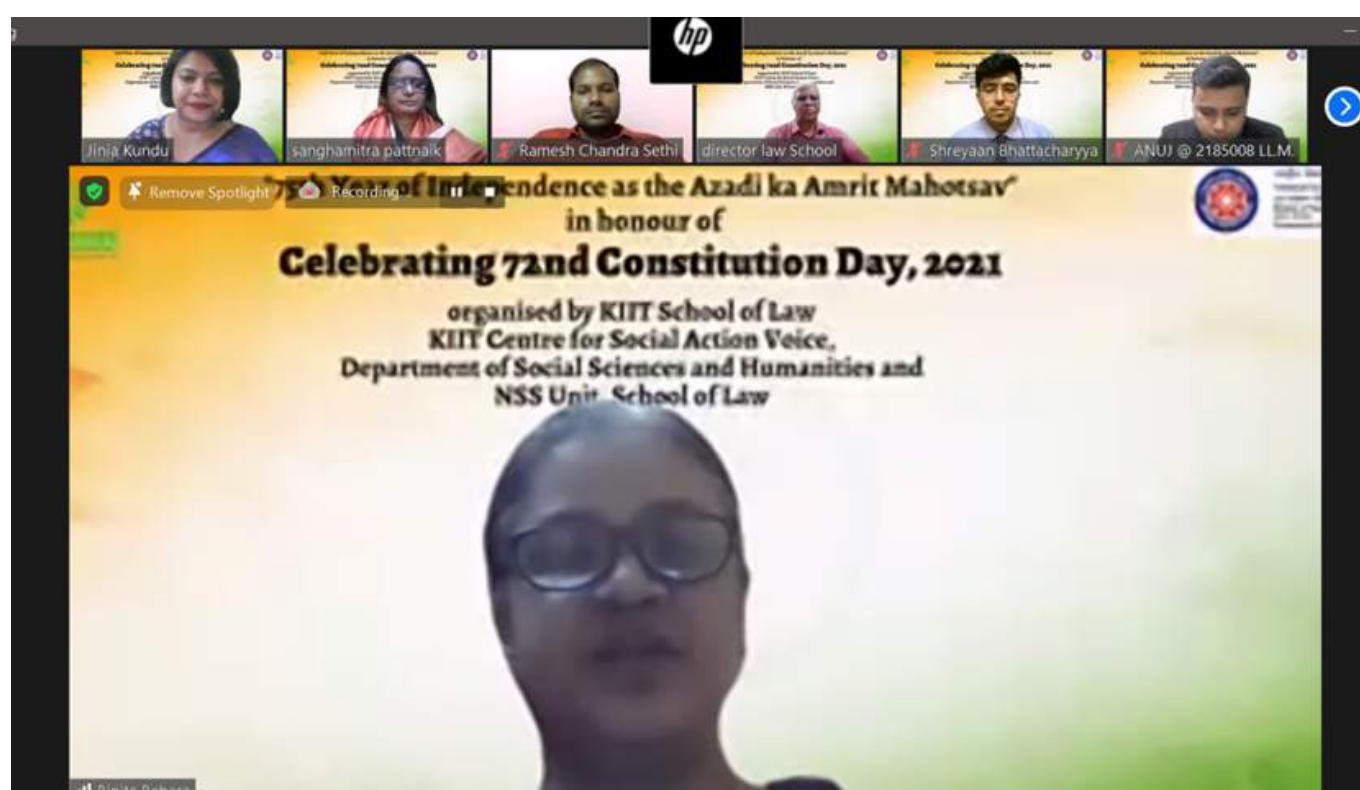
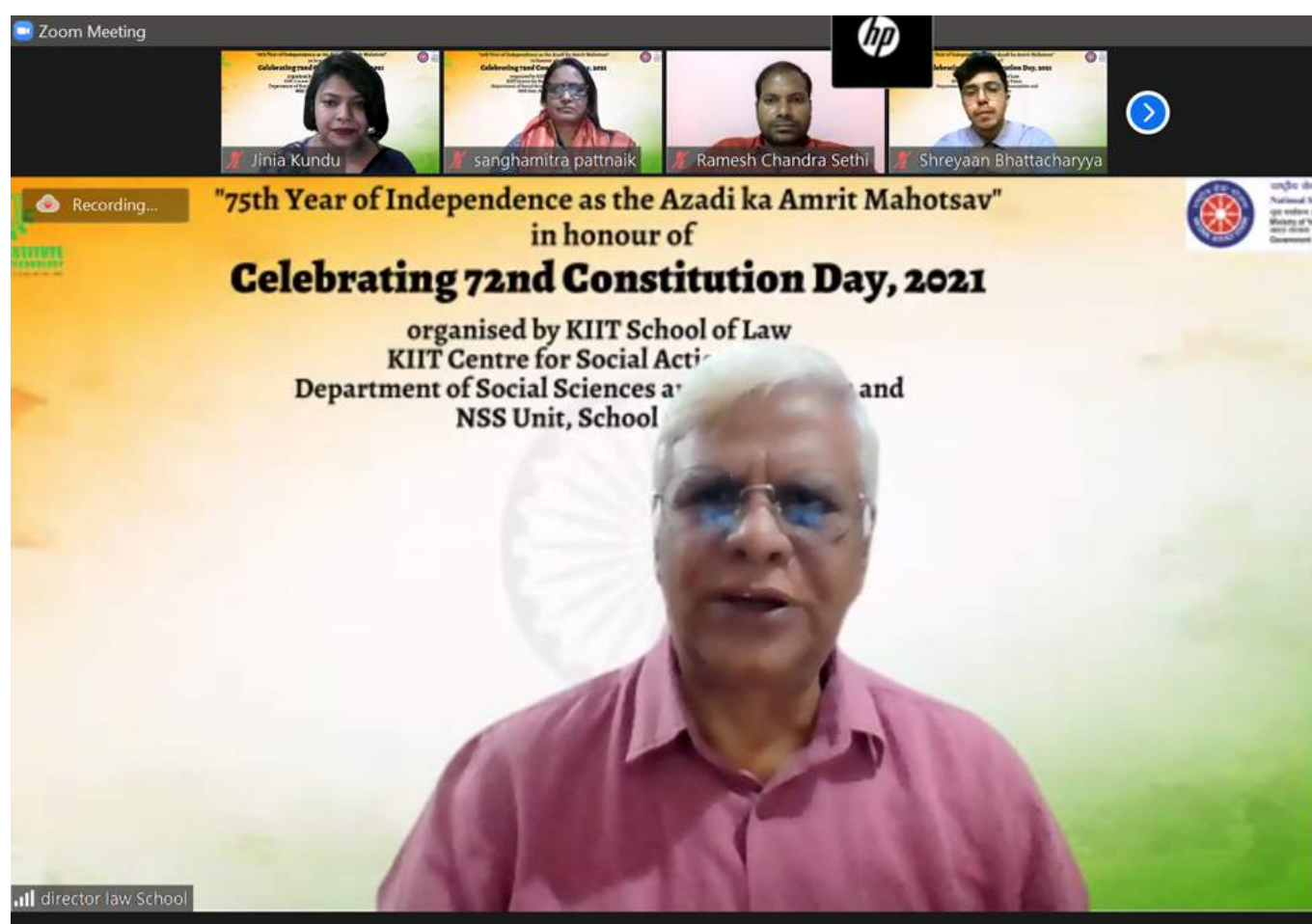


KIIT Law School Celebrates 72nd Constitution Day, 2021

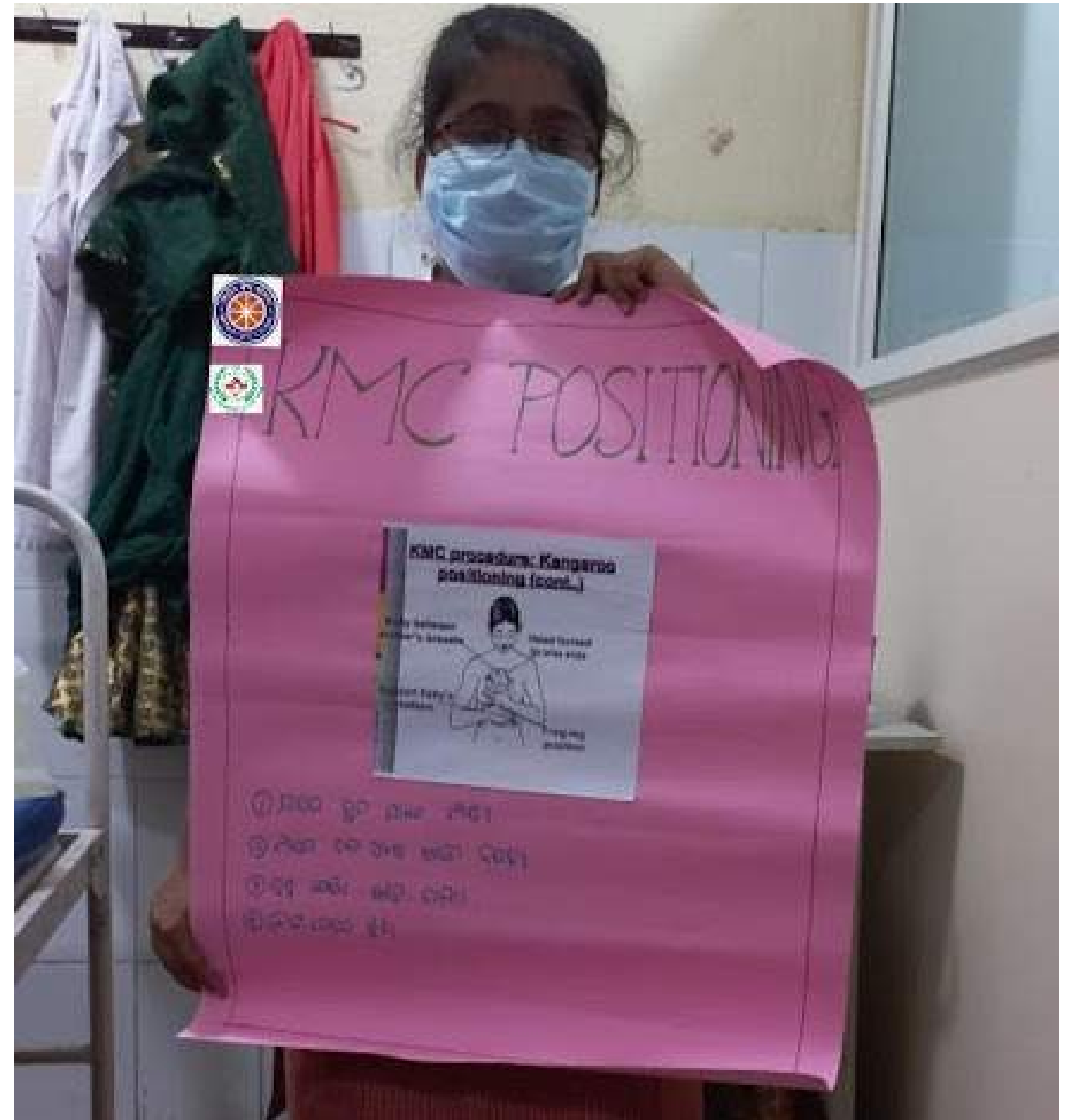

AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON “KANGAROO MOTHER CARE” BY KINS NSS

The NSS wing of Kalinga Institute of Nursing Sciences (KINS) organized an awareness program on “Importance of Kangaroo Mother Care” in NICU of KIMS on 30th November 2021. The awareness program was conducted by NSS volunteers of B.Sc. Nursing 3rd year students of KINS under the mentor-ship of NSS Program Officers, Ms. Daini Sunita Tutors, KINS. Kangaroo mother care is a method of care of preterm infants. The method involves infants being carried, usually by the mother, with skin-to-skin contact. This guide is intended for health professionals responsible for the care of low-birth-weight and preterm infants. Designed to be adapted to local conditions, it provides guidance on how to organize services at the referral level and on what is needed to provide effective kangaroo mother care. The guide includes practical advice on when and how the kangaroo-mother-care method can best be applied. The programme was conducted for the helping mothers to reduce anxiety and stress also. It was conducted peacefully and carefully for creating awareness and benefits.

Childhood is the best time of one's life. It's the time when we play with colours and imagine a world of our own. It is wonderful to see those colours appear on canvases.

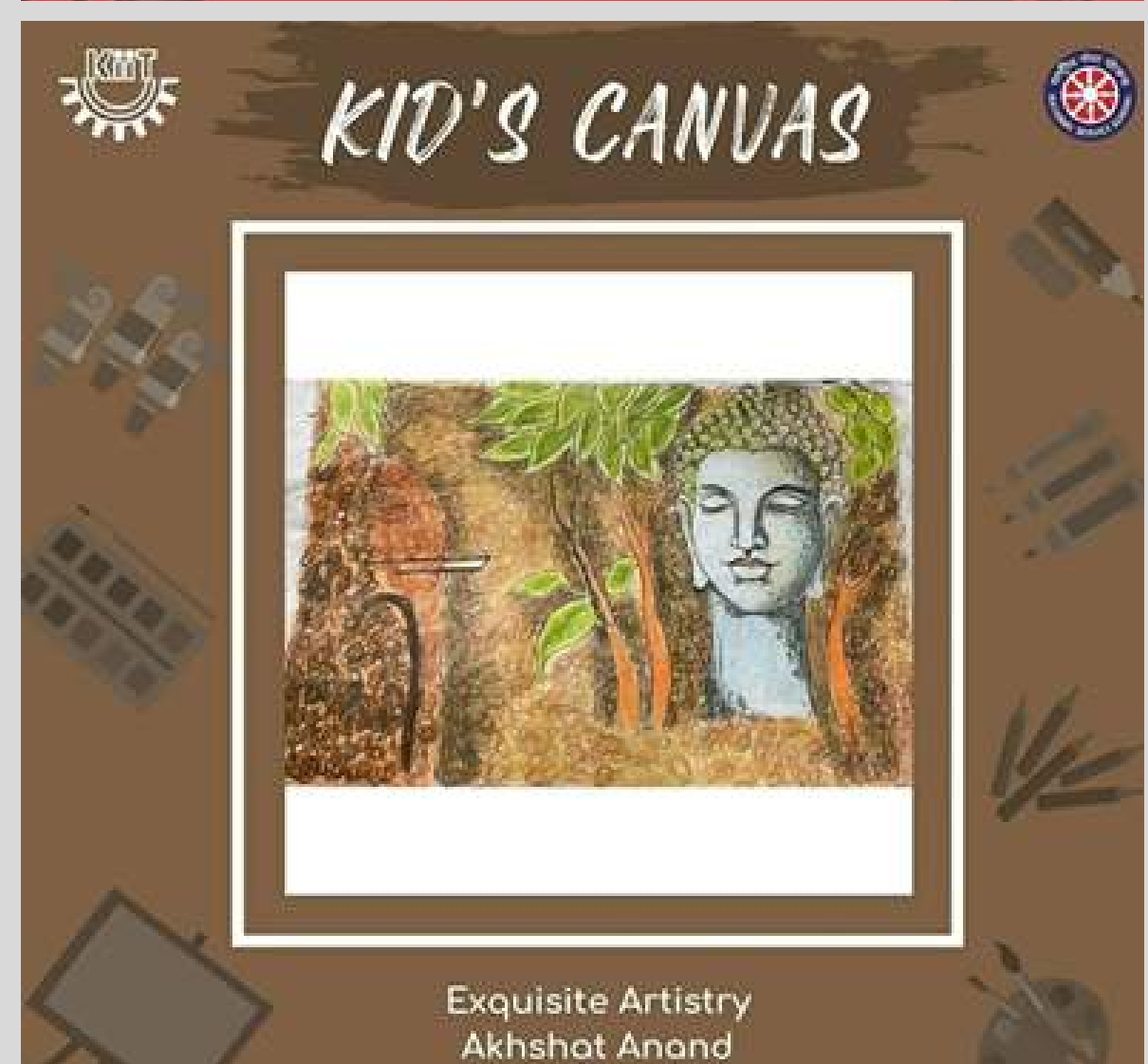
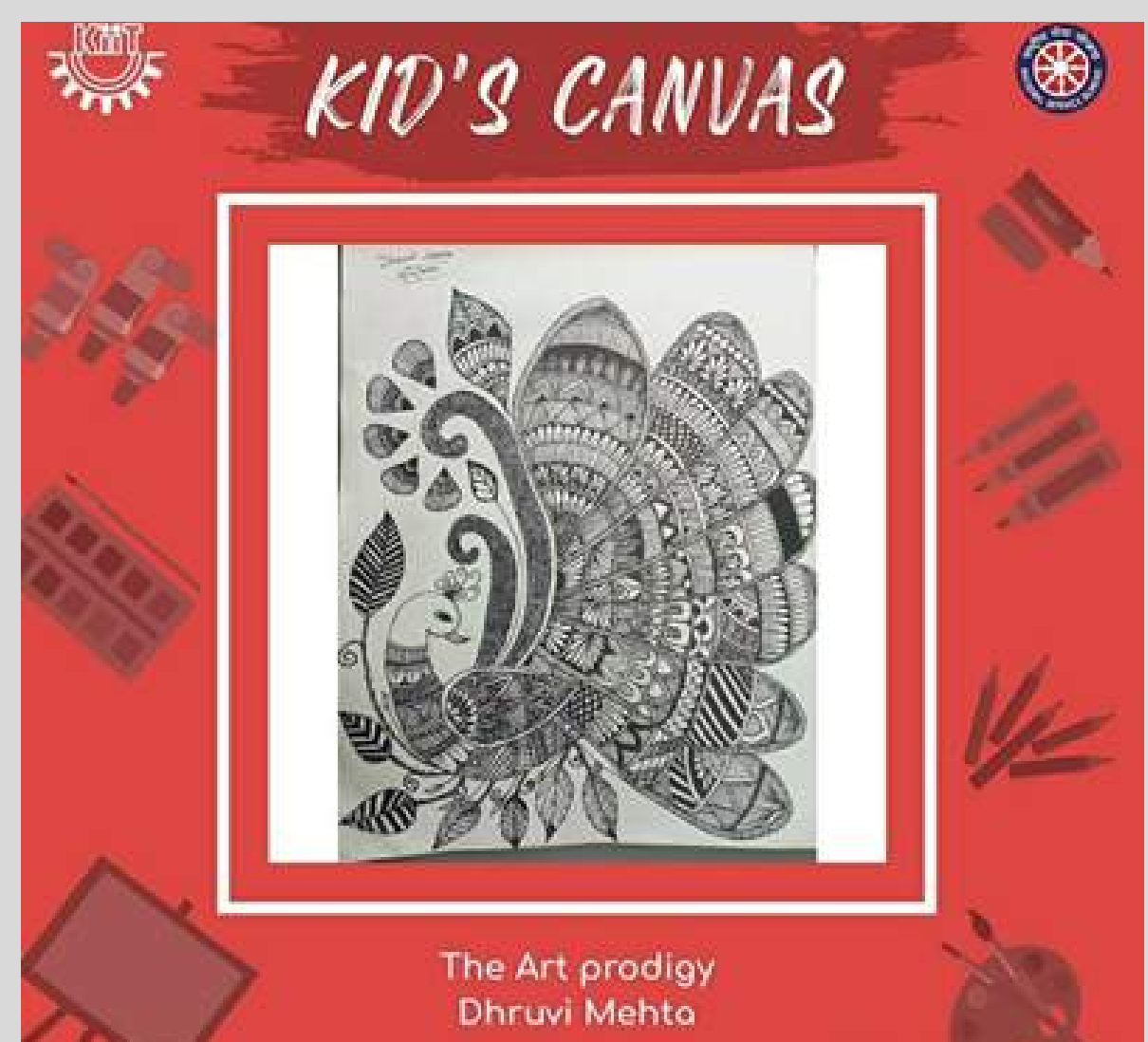

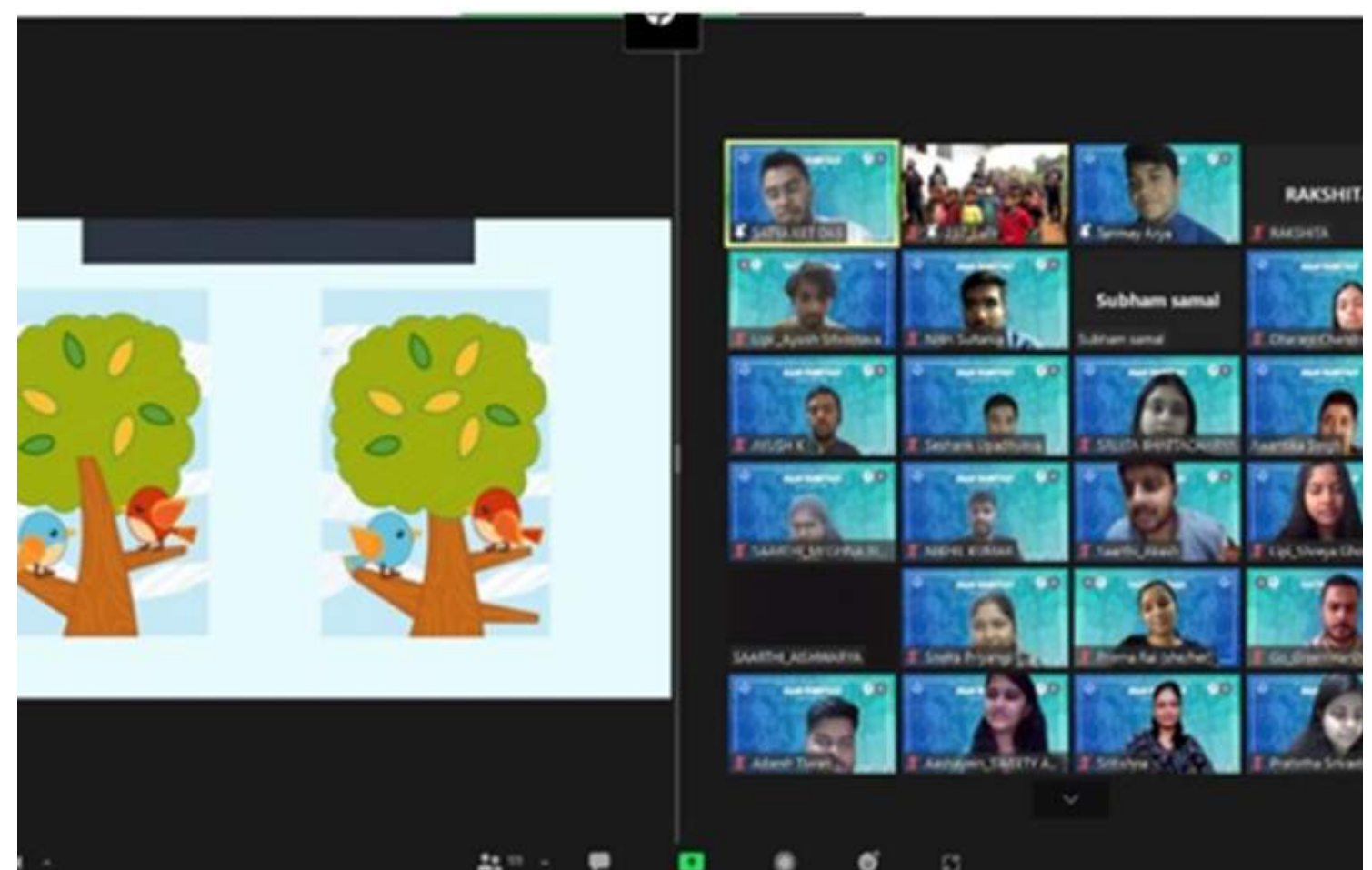
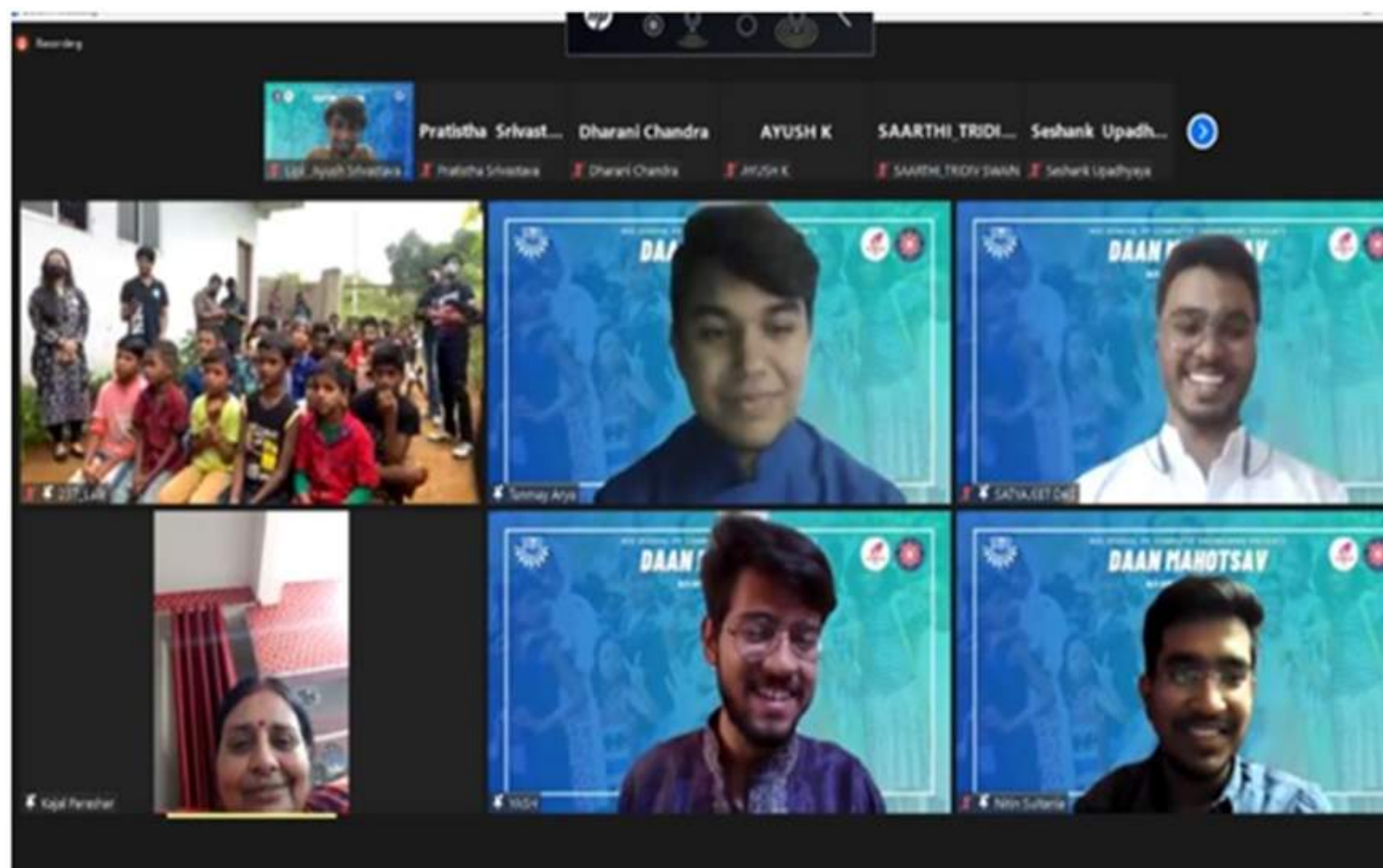


NSS KIIT School of Computer Engineering Celebrates 'DAAN Mahotsav'

First aid box with dressing material and sanitizer was provided to the headmaster for future use.

AI Disease Recognition

When we need to diagnose our diseases or illnesses, we go to the doctor for treatment for buying those prescription medicines, we go to the drug store. But this might not be possible for some people like the elderly living on their own or the people with a very tight schedule or people doing self-quarantine. But with the advancement in the field of AI technology, this can be solved with deep learning to recognise and diagnose known diseases from our handheld cellular devices.

Deep Learning AI has been used in the detection of diseases from medical images since 2012. AI has become more accurate in identifying diseases in those medical images and has become a more viable source of diagnostic information in the past few years. Many research works show that disease diagnostic performances between deep learning models and healthcare professionals are comparatively equivalent. Deep learning AI is also being used in the field of skin disease medical service. Researchers use real-time, individualized and extensible skin disease recognition deep learning models for more reliable and effective recognition.

Mental disorders and behavioural disorders can also be analyzed with the help of advanced AI models to analyze pre-recorded videos or real-time video captures of a patient.

Cloud computing can also be used along with this for running advanced Deep Learning models in remote medical data centres and provide a diagnosed result to the user. This user-provided data can also be used for further training the AI model for the overall betterment of the recognition framework. The software can then show recommended medicine to the user based on the result and prompt the user to order the prescribed drugs online or provide a nearby drug store location based on availability. We need to start implementing these technologies as soon as possible to prevent the next web deadly epidemic.



Synthetic Fuel as an Alternative.

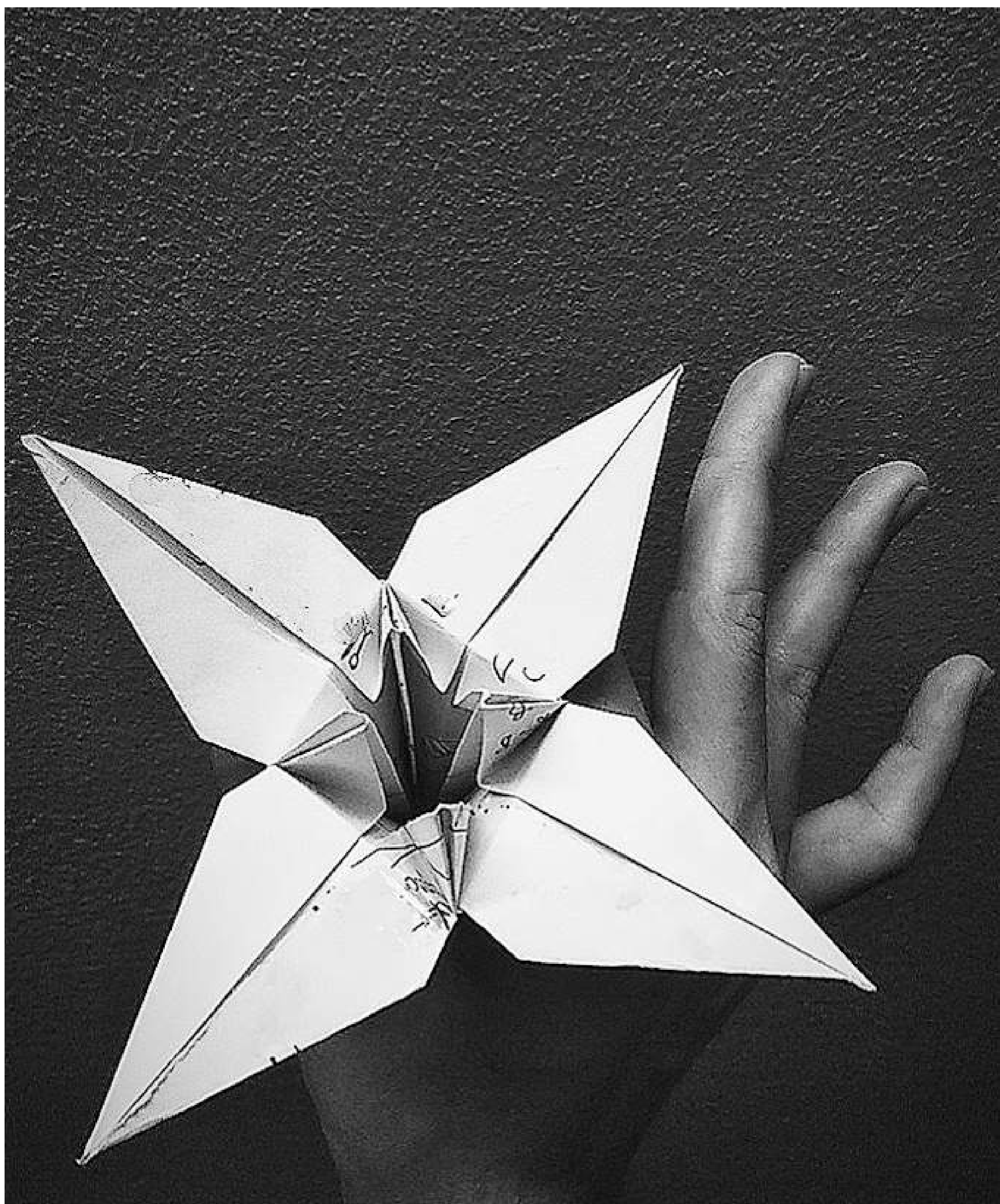
Everyone is banging on the concept of going fully electric. Most countries are targeting their Automotive industry to go 100% Electric within the next few decades. Electric Vehicles are supposed to be cleaner and not harm the environment. It's the Greener Way. However, this is not the case. Electric Vehicles run on electric motors powered rechargeable batteries, which have to be manufactured. The manufacturing process, however, is NOT CLEAN. The batteries are mass produced in large factories that produce these Batteries in a Not-So-Eco Friendly way. So in the end, it is merely shifting the source of pollution from the road to the factory. Also, electric vehicles suffer from range anxiety i.e. the range provided by electric vehicles is a big challenge to the Automotive Manufacturers today. So one might wonder What the answer to the fuel crisis today is.

Synthetic Fuel might be the Answer to this fuel crisis we face today. Sure, like all Internal Combustion Engines it creates pollution. But it also counters this problem by creating what is known as Carbon-Neutral-Environment. Basically, what the process of manufacturing synthetic fuel does is take CO₂ from Air, Water from any other source(say, seawater) and combine the Hydrogen and Carbon to form a fuel, say Octane(C₈H₁₈). Again, when the Carbon in the Octane Fuel is burnt in the engine, it returns back to Air as CO₂. Also, the energy value of the Synthetic fuel can be made and modified as per the engine requirement. This way the engine efficiency can be improved. With Synthetic Fuel, not only the fuel crisis is solved, the pollution is also kept at a check as a constant cycle of Carbon is formed.

Porsche is one of the few Automotive Manufacturers looking at this alternative as a possibility while most have chosen the Green Way. With Synthetic Fuel, the Automotive Industry will not only be freed from the shackles of Dependency on Dead Dinosaurs from deep within the Earth's surface but also help to save billions of cars from being scrapped all over the world.

In this era, there were huge inventions of various scientific entities, theories, concepts, devices etc in terms of structural design, component design, component tightening and various other aspects. For example, wheels! Wheels are an invention. But transforming them into a movable vehicle is what we call Innovation. So you see what's been done here? The Invention has initiated the values of Science but Innovation grows Science. And by being the human beings of the 21st century we do know how important the mechanism of growth holds into anything.

Steering and Suspension, and Maglev

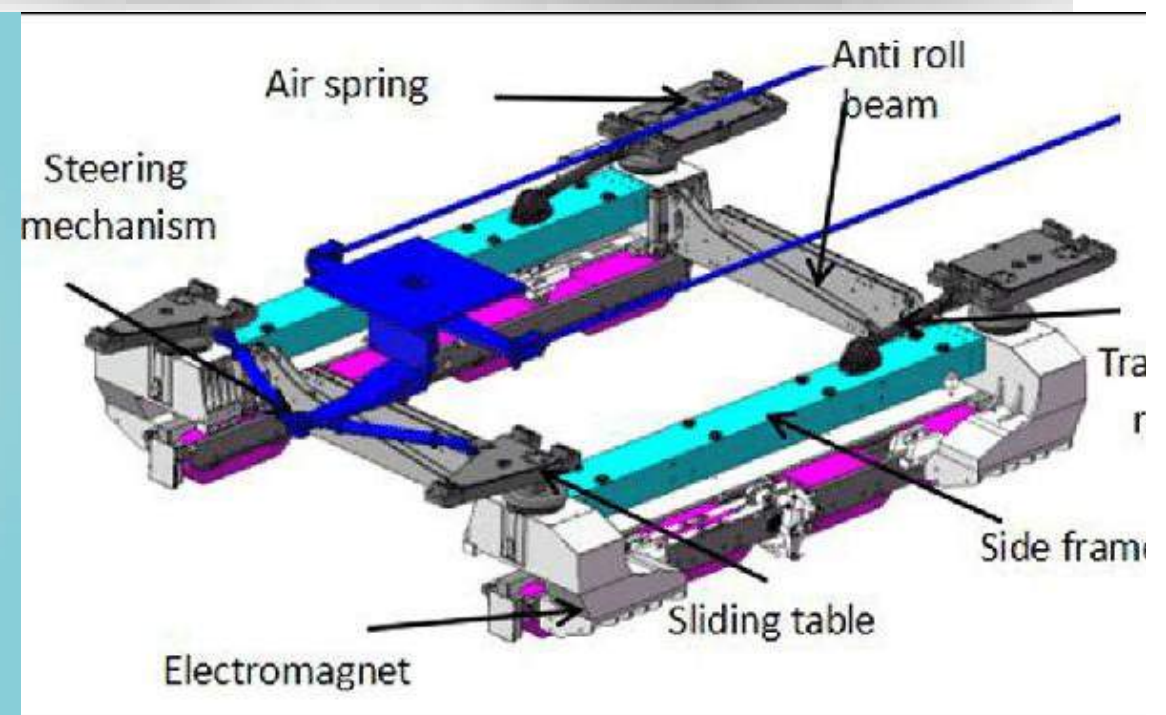
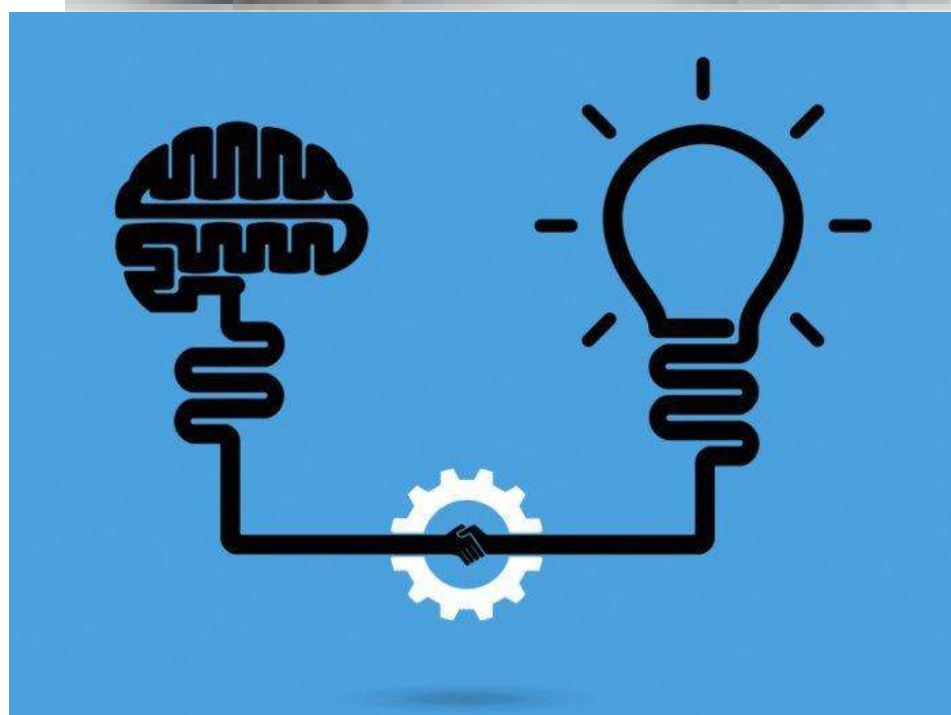

Steering and Suspension, and Maglev- Basically, it is the idea where we design a bike whose front suspension is being sprung & dampened using maglev and the steering is also being controlled using the principle of electromagnetism used in maglev technology.

Maglev refers to magnetic levitation, where an electromagnet is used to suspend a body a distance from the magnet.

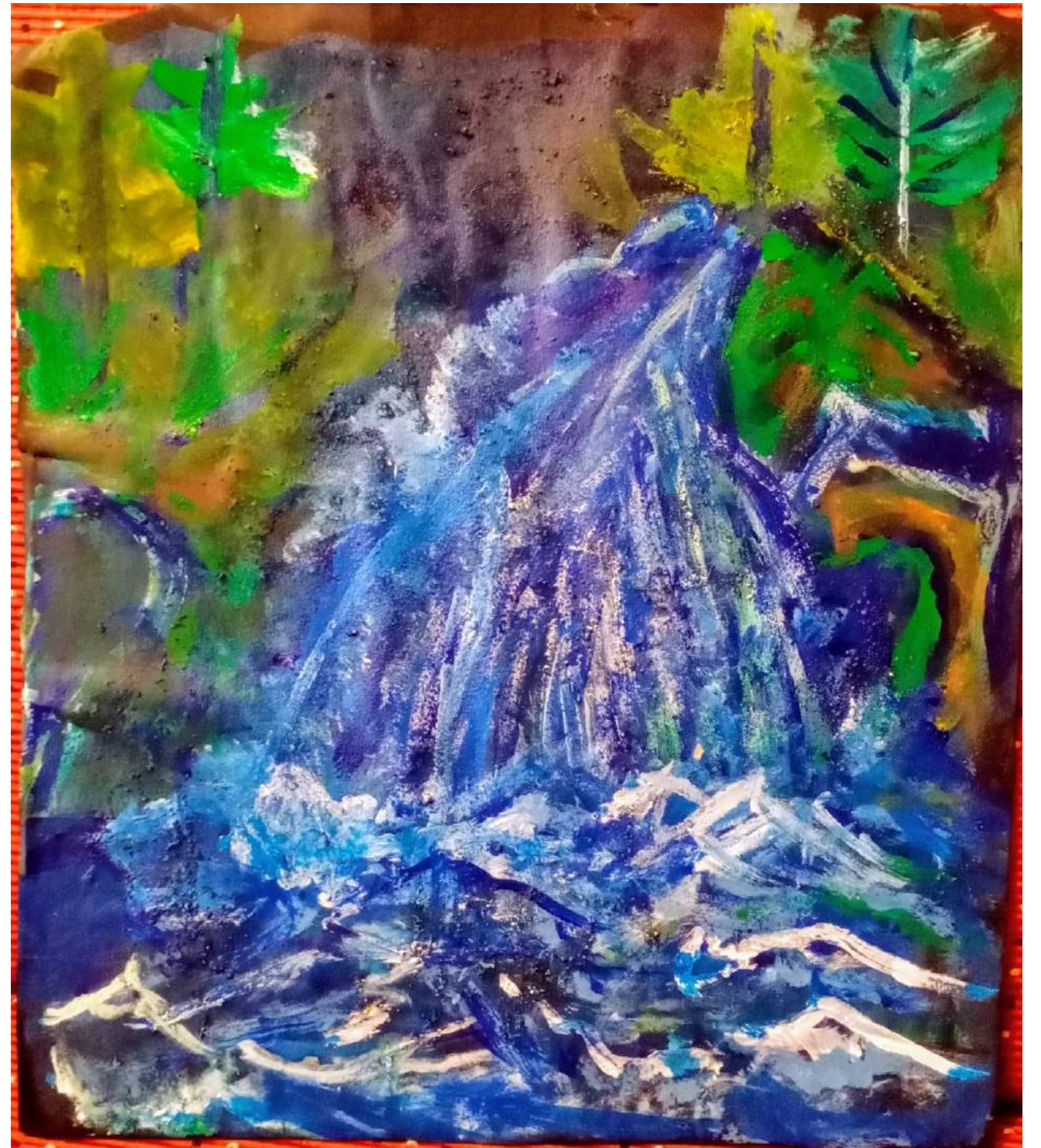
Basically, the vehicle is able to steer the wheel as well as keep the wheel in one place with the dampening of the suspension through the help of the hall effect sensor and electromagnetism Hall effect states the production of a voltage difference across an electrical conductor, transverse to an electric current in the conductor and to an applied magnetic field perpendicular to the current flow. Here the electronics circuit consists of, resistor (control the amount of voltage in digital scale to control levitation), hall effect IC with a copper amplifier built in, for example S-5712 series (produce low level signal and thus requires amplification), diodes (help in reverse current protection). Wires power supply and wireless power transmitter coil (to check whether the system is working or not), and Arduino single board microcontroller (program it to execute the intuition). Hall sensor measures the voltage in a different digital scale and strength of magnetic field as input. We write a program which will determine whether the axle will get magnetized or not. For example, it is tested that the electromagnet is magnetized when the north pole is moved away from the Hall element when the voltage value increases over the basic point and vice versa. Therefore, increasing the voltage value is directly proportional to the increasing the distance between the electromagnetic axle and the circular hall effect IC. Thus, this is the intuition of the suspension dampening. So basically, For the suspension system, a circular hall sensor is placed which helps to measure distance and with the help of programming, the axle is maintained to levitate at the centre of the wheel as we can see from diagrams. Even after encountering bumps and cracks on roads, the axle returns to its normal position.

Now you might be wondering about how the wheels will be rotating if they are attracted by a magnet for steering purposes. For that reason we have used the concept of gradual change in polarity, considering the wheel is turning left. Then the front part of the left steering plate's magnet will have attraction while the rear part will have deflection. For the right steering plate the front part will have deflection and the rear part would have attraction. However the change in polarity from attraction to deflection will be gradual and not exponential.
